The Eat Smart Guidelines are a set of nutrition related recommendations for child care facilities which were written to help providers create a food and nutrition environment that will ultimately improve the health of our children. There are three levels; Minimum, Intermediate, and Advanced. Because children learn their food habits early, we can make a difference by modeling and teaching them good, healthy eating habits. We now have a written food and nutrition policy and a physical activity policy in place.
